Beginning with the Class of 2020, students have access to a Career and Technical Education sequence of courses as a graduation pathway. Students who pursue this pathway do not need to meet the English and mathematics requirements separately. English and mathematics content are embedded and this pathway meets the purpose of a high school diploma: to declare that a student is ready for success in postsecondary education, gainful employment, and citizenship, and is equipped with the skills to be a lifelong learner (RCW 28A.230.090).

- At least one of the credits within these 2.0 credits must offer the student the potential of earning Dual-Credit (DC), earning both high school and college credit, OR the potential of earning an Industry Recognized Credential (IRC)
- The 2 credits must be within the same OSPI program area
